2 1 1	Some words and phrases are subject to varying interpretations, and that an ethical principle may conflict with another	
2 1 2	Questions related to ethical conflicts can best be answered by thoughtful consideration of the fundamental principles, rather than reliance on detailed or specific regulations.

2 1	Certification and/or Inspection reports and collateral records are retained as follows:
2 1 1	Paper records – 4 years after close of file
2 1 2	Digital records – Indefinitely
2 1 3	Adopted standards (Manual of Millwork and/or Architectural Woodwork Standards) - Indefinitely
3	<b>CONSULTING REVIEWS</b> are non-inspections and are unofficial in nature, conducted at the discretion and convenience of WI's Director's of Architectural Services (DAS), and:
3 1	Are not part of any WI certification and/or inspection service.
3 2	Verbal remarks made during such review are consultive only and not an official opinion of the Institute unless confirmed in writing.
4	<b>INSPECTIONS</b> are scheduled and processed as timely as possible; however, may take up to 14 days, and:
4 1	Require an executed "Request and Authorization to Inspect" form, full payment of the appropriate inspection fees, and:
4 2	Are based on compliance with the requirements of contract documents and our adopted standards unless specifically agreed otherwise in writing, and:
4 2 1	All inspected items and findings will be itemized
4 3	Are sent to the Administrative Office for processing within three (3) working days of their completion
4 4	Are published to applicable parties (architect/designer, contractor, fabricator/installer, requesting party, and IOR) within five (5) working days of their receipt by first class mail, and:
4 4 1	By fax or email if so requested
4 5	It is the responsibility of the requesting and/or contractual parties to:

5 1	Adopted and published jointly as our industry standard for architectural millwork in which the materials, fabrication, workmanship, installation, and aesthetics are established dependent on the Grade or Grades specified, use of which clearly and completely:	
5 1 1	Defines all materials and joinery	
5 1 2	Fosters fair competition with all bidders using one standard of quality	
5 1 3	Prohibits the substitution of unknown or inferior materials and/or joinery	
5 1 4	Takes the guess work out of 'or equal' clauses; and is non-discriminatory	
5 1 4 1	A design professional may, but only by means of the drawings and/or specifications, modify any and all grades, and:	
5 1 4 1 1	Such modifications shall govern and take precedence over the grade rules, and any inspection and/or re-inspection shall be made based on these modifications	
5 2	Is provided free of cost to Design Professionals and General Contractors in our service area, and	
5 2 1	Is sold to all others.

6 1	Is an established discipline of quality control for shop drawings, millwork and/or installation, as specified by the design professional, for use in conjunction with the North American Architectural Woodwork Standards (NAAWS), which:
6 1 1	Provides a non-biased means of confirming conformance to a project's plans and specifications wherein:
6 1 1 1	For Shop Drawings, evidence of certification is provided by means of an individually serial numbered CCP shop drawing label or digitally signed image, attached to the first page of the original shop drawing set
6 1 1 2	For Millwork and Installation, evidence of certification is provided by issuance of a CCP certificate, listing the items certified, the applicable grade(s), and whether installation is included, and:
6 1 1 2 1	Each elevation of casework and/or countertops shall bear an individually serial numbered CCP label (if so specified).
6 2	Is a flat rate fee program, as published on WI's website, honored on any projects located within the Institute's service area of Arizona, California, Hawaii, Nevada, Oregon and Utah or throughout the continental United States on projects when such is specified by design professionals from our service area, and:
6 2 1	On all project specifications only requiring certification of shop drawings, without the requirement for certification of product, and/or installation – stand alone shop drawing certification is applicable
6 2 2	On project specifications only requiring certification of product and/or installation, without requirement for certification of shop drawings - full certification, including shop drawings is applicable and required
6 2 3	An additional fee is applicable on phased projects (including up to two hours of on-site inspection time) for each additional phase
6 2 4	Additional costs will be charged for certification on projects outside of the Institute's service area of California, Nevada, Oregon, Arizona, Utah and Hawaii, as published on WI's website
6 2 5	It is the responsibility of the millwork fabricator and/or installer to include within their bid all costs for certification

6 4 1	The Institute, within a reasonable length of time of request, will send a qualified WI inspector to inspect work in question, who will:

6 4 1 1 1	Confirming that all materials, fabrication, and/or installation are as specified, or:
6 4 1 1 1 1	Detailing any non-compliant conditions found to exist

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<b>MONITORED COMPLIANCE PROGRAM (MCP):</b>

7 1	Is an established discipline of quality control which provides ongoing review/inspections of the project from the beginning through certification at completion and:
7 1 1	Self-certification is not allowed
7 1 2	All fabricators and/or installers are required to comply with the inspection requirements.
7 2	Is a percentage fee program, as published on WI's website, based on the millwork portion of the contract (minimum set fee for those projects less than \$100,000) encompassing review of shop drawing, fabrication and installation, honored on any project located within the Institute's service area of Arizona, California, and Nevada, and:
7 2 1	Fees in excess of \$6,000, may be made in 3 payments subject to:
7 2 1 1	The first payment shall be the base rate of \$3,000 and 1/3 of the certification fees, payable at the time the request to monitor is made
7 2 1 2	The second payment shall be for ½ the remainder of unpaid certification fees, payable at the midpoint of inspections, as determined by the DAS
7 2 1 3	The third and final payment shall be for the remainder of certification fees including any adjustments for modifications or change orders, payable prior to the final inspection
7 2 2	Additional costs will be charged for projects outside of the Institute's service area of California, Nevada and Arizona, as published on WI's website
7 2 3	It is the responsibility of the architectural millwork fabricator and/or installer to include within their bid any and all costs for certification

7 4 2 1	Written reports are generated after each monitoring inspection, noting any non-compliant findings along with a general statement of the project's progress
7 4 2 2	Reports are processed from the administrative office and forwarded to each contact of record for the architect/owner, millwork fabricator and/or installer, and general contractor, and:
7 4 2 2 1	Subsequent inspections will re-address and update the status of any previous non-compliant findings
7 4 2 2 2	Non-compliant job-site conditions and the potential adverse impact of such to the project's millwork products will be noted; however:
7 4 2 2 2 1	Subsequent final inspection and/or monitored certification will not be impacted by the compliance of such
7 4 2 3	Upon conducting a final compliant inspection, WI will:
7 4 2 3 1	Attach a MCP label to each elevation of casework and countertop
7 4 2 3 2	Issue a MCP certificate certifying that the millwork products and their installation furnished for this project fully meet all the requirements of the contract documents and the NAAWS for the Grade(s) specified
7 5	May be requested by completing the WI "Request and Authorization To Monitor" form, and submitting such to the appropriate WI Director of Architectural Services (DAS) along with a copy of:

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8	<p><b>CERTIFIED SEISMIC INSTALLATION PROGRAM (CSIP):</b></p> 
8 1	Is an established discipline of quality control for use with WI's engineered OSHPD seismic casework installation pre-approvals, which:
8 1 1	Can be used as an expansion of WI's CC and MC programs or as a stand-alone certification program
8 1 2	Provides a non-biased means of confirming conformance to a projects specific seismic casework installation in wall blocking, fastener size, frequency and location requirements
8 1 3	Provides review of shop drawings for blocking location requirements, and if:
8 1 3 1	In conjunction with either the CC or MC program's evidence of compliance is provided by means of an individually serial numbered CCP shop drawing label or digitally signed image applied to the first page of the certified submittal
8 1 3 2	Not in conjunction with either the CC or MC program's evidence of compliance is provided by means of the individually serial numbered CSIP certificate
8 2	Fees are as posted on the WI website and honored on any project located within the Institute's service area of Arizona, California, and Nevada, and:
8 2 1	Additional costs will be charged for CSIP on projects outside of the Institute's service area of California, Nevada and Arizona, as published on the WI website
8 2 2	The installer is required to comply with the requirements of CSIP when so specified, and:
8 2 2 1	It is the responsibility of the architectural millwork fabricator and/or installer to include within their bid any and all costs for CSIP
8 3	May be requested by completing the WI "Request and Authorization To Monitor" form, and submitting such to the appropriate WI Director of Architectural Services (DAS).
8 4	Inspections will be conducted during a project's installation, and:
8 4 1	The actual number of inspections required will be determined by the WI DAS
8 4 2	Written reports will be generated noting any non-compliant findings along with a general statement of the project's progress, and:
8 4 2 1	Forwarded to each contact of record for the architect/owner, millwork fabricator and/or installer, and general contractor.

8 5	Certified Seismic Installation Compliance may be requested by completing the WI "Request and Authorization To Inspect" form and submitting such to the appropriate WI Director of Architectural Services (DAS) or WI's Administrative office, along with access to or a copy of:

9 1	When requested and on a fee basis, a WI Director of Architectural Services (DAS) will be made available for independent inspection service with respect to issues pertaining to the architectural millwork industry as defined or covered by NAAWS.
9 2	Fees are as posted on WI's website and are honored on any project located within the Institute's service area of Arizona, California, and Nevada, and:
9 2 1	Additional costs, as published on WI's website, will be charged for IIS on projects outside of the Institute's service area of California, Nevada and Arizona
9 3	May be requested by completing the WI "Request and Authorization To Monitor" form, and submitting such to the appropriate WI Director of Architectural Services (DAS).
9 4	Inspection(s) will be based on the NAAWS, Custom Grade unless the project specifications or specific written direction by the requesting party provides otherwise, and:
9 4 1	If inspection(s) is to be based on other standards, specification, or requirements, a full copy of such shall be provided to the Institute at the time of an Independent Inspection Service request
9 5	DAS assignment will be based on availability and efficiency of field office location for travel.

10 1	When requested and on a fee basis, a WI Director of Architectural Services (DAS) will be made available for expert opinions and/or witness service with respect to issues pertaining to the architectural millwork industry as defined within or covered by the North American Architectural Woodwork Standards (NAAWS)
10 2	Is available within WI's service area of Arizona, California, and Nevada, and:
10 2 1	Fees are as posted on the WI website, honored on any project located within the Institute's service area of Arizona, California, and Nevada, and:
10 2 2	Additional costs, as published on WI's website, will be charged for EWS on projects outside of the Institute's service area of California, Nevada and Arizona
10 3	May be requested by completion of the WI 'Request for Expert Opinion / Witness Service' form by a contractual party (owner, design professional, contractor or supplier/fabricator) to our Administrative Office, and:
10 3 1	A paid physical inspection to review and formulate an opinion and written report on the issue(s) in question:
10 3 2	If additional deposition, testimony or court appearance time is required, it will be charged separately on a per hour basis, as posted on the WI website, subject to:
10 3 2 1	A minimum of one hour for each occurrence, with additional time beyond the first hour billed in quarter hour increments
10 3 2 2	A per hour charge as posted on the WI Website, (discounted as applicable) for all time spent away from the DAS's field office, not to exceed 8 hours per day (including all travel and/or standby time), and:
10 3 2 2 1	Billed in quarter hour increments
10 4	DAS assignment will be based on availability and the efficiency of field office location for travel.

11 1	When requested and on a fee basis, a WI Director of Architectural Services (DAS) will be made available for site condition inspection service with respect to issues pertaining to the architectural millwork industry as defined within or covered by the North American Architectural Woodwork Standards (NAAWS)
11 2	Is available for the standard flat rate fee, as posted on the WI Website, on any projects located within the Institute's service area of Arizona, California, Nevada, and Oregon; however:
11 2 1	Additional on-site inspection time after the first hour shall be billed, as posted on WI's Website, per hour, in quarter hour increments
11 3	May be requested by completion of the WI 'Request and Authorization to Inspect' form by a contractual party (owner, design professional, contractor or supplier/fabricator) to our Administrative Office, with:
11 3 1	Payment of estimated cost in advance of service
11 4	Inspection(s) will be based on Section 2 of the NAAWS, unless the project specifications provide otherwise, and:
11 4 1	If inspection(s) is to be based on other standards or specification requirements, a full copy of such shall be provided to the Institute at the time of a Site Condition Inspection Service request
11 5	DAS assignment will be based on availability and efficiency of field office location for travel.

1	<b>THE INSTITUTE OFFERS ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF PRODUCTS</b> conforming to the appropriate minimum requirements of our published Standards, including adhesives, finishes, hardware, laminates, solid surface, panel products. etc.
1 1	<u>Products not requiring independent testing</u> , require applicants to submit:
1 1 1	A physical sample
1 1 2	Sales and technical literature
1 1 3	Letter attesting to minimum NAAWS compliance
